Tamil Nadu

* Priests Pension Scheme

- > Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin has introduced a pension hike scheme for priests.
- > The pension of rural temple priests has been increased from Rs 3,000 to Rs 4,000.
- > The pension of Odhuvars, Musicians and Araiyars has been enhanced from Rs.1,000 to Rs.3,000.

* Creation of a new department

- A new Department of Natural Resources has been created in Tamil Nadu. This includes the Department of Mines and Minerals.
- > Tamil Nadu Water Resources Minister Durai Murugan will take charge of the new department.
- It has been decided to bring the Directorate of Geology and Mines, Tamil Nadu Minerals Corporation Limited and Tamil Nadu Magnesite Corporation under the control of Natural Resources Department.

* Sustainable cotton movement

- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin launched a new scheme called Sustainable Cotton Mission at an estimated cost of Rs 11 crore for the benefit of cotton farmers.
- Cotton is called 'white gold'. Tamil Nadu is one of the leading cotton reeling states in the country. Most of the cotton spinning mills are in Coimbatore.

✤ e-Rental

- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Venkaiah Naidu has launched an app called "e-Rent" to book and rent agricultural machinery online. Stalin has introduced it.
- > The Tamil Nadu government also provides subsidy to registered farmers.

19th International Film Festival

At the 19th International Film Festival of India held in Chennai, 'Sivaranjaniyum Yeti Pennum' won the best picture award.

CM releases book of eight-year-old boy

Chief Minister M.K.Stalin released a book titled The Adventures of Shing and Shang in Mystery Island written by an eight-year-old girl, Magizhini Ilancheliyan.

* Statue of Pennycuick in England

Chief Minister M K Stalin announced that a statue of Colonel John Penny Cuick, who built the Mullai Periyar dam, would be installed in Camberly, Uk.

Visually impaired people can also contest in co-operative society elections *

- An amendment bill was passed in the Assembly to make the visually impaired candidates eligible to contest in the co-operative society elections.
- > Part IX(b) of the Constitution of India describes a co-operative society.
- Clause 243(ZH) to 243 (ZT) of Section IX(b) deals with co-operative societies.
- > The 97th Amendment to the Constitution lists the right to form co-operative societies within Article 19(1)(c).
- The Montagu Chelmsford Reform was brought under the Co-operative Regional List in 1919.
- ✤ Birthday of Rani Velunachiyar (1730-1796)
 - > On January 3, Prime Minister Narendra Modi remembered and paid tributes to The Queen of Sivagangai Velu Nachiyar on her birth anniversary.
 - Period of Velunachiyar: The languages that Velunachiyar learnt were Tamil, English, French and Urdu.
 - > Thandavaraya is the minister of Velunachiyar. The generals are big and small. The woman commander is the commander.
- Tamil Nadu police's first woman intelligence IG **
 - > Asiyammal has been appointed as the IG of Intelligence bureau in Tamil Nadu. She is the first woman IG of intelligence in Tamil Nadu police.

Fourth Police Commission

- > In Tamil Nadu, the Fourth Police Commission has been constituted under the chairmanship of retired High Court Judge C.T. Selvam to improve police-public relations.

** Tahdco chairman u. Appointment of Mathivanan

- Former minister U Mathivanan has been appointed as the chairman of TAHDCO. The announcement to this effect was made by Chief Minister M K Stalin.
- The Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Housing and Development Corporation Limited (TAHDCO) was incorporated in 1974 under the Companies Act, 1956 with the objective of improving the socioeconomic status of Tamil Nadu.

Chennai Medavakkam-Sholinganallur Road Renamed

- Chennai Chief Minister M K Stalin has announced that the Medavakkam Sholinganallur Link Road, where the new campus of the Central Institute of Classical Tamil is located, will now be renamed as "Classical Road".
- > On October 14, 2004, Tamil was declared as a classical language by the Government of India.
- The Central Institute of Classical Tamil was inaugurated by the Government of India on 18th August, 2007.

* Corporation elections 11 mayoral posts reserved for women

- 50 per cent of the seats in local bodies are reserved for women. Accordingly, the post of mayor in 9 municipal corporations has been reserved for women (general category).
- Two posts of Mayor of Corporations have been reserved for Scheduled Caste women and one post of Mayor of a Corporation is reserved for a man or woman belonging to scheduled caste.
- There are 21 Corporations in Tamil Nadu viz., Chennai, Madurai, Coimbatore, Trichy, Salem, Tirunelveli, Tiruppur, Erode, Vellore, Thoothukudi, Thanjavur, Dindigul, Hosur, Nagercoil, Avadi, Tambaram, Kancheepuram, Karur, Kumbakonam, Cuddalore and Sivakasi.

***** Voters in Tamil Nadu

- A total of 10.17 lakh new voters have been added to the electoral rolls of Tamil Nadu. The total number of electors in Tamil Nadu stands at 6,36,25,815.
- Male voters: 3.12 crore, female voters: 3.23 crore
- The constituency with the highest number of voters is: Sholinganallur, the constituency with the least number of voters: Kilvelur, Nagapattinam.

* Election Amount Ceiling

- > The upper limit for Lok Sabha elections has been increased from Rs 70 lakh to Rs 95 lakh.
- > The ceiling for the state assembly election amount has been increased from Rs 28 lakh to Rs 40 lakh.

* Office of Tamil Inscriptions

In order to preserve the copies of Tamil inscriptions (inks) and related Tamil documents, the Office of the Deputy Superintendent of Archaeology, Southern Region, Archaeological Survey of India, Chennai has been converted into the Office of the Deputy Superintendent of Tamil Inscriptions.

Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve gets International (TX2 Award)

Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve has been awarded the International Award, the TX2 Award, for more than doubling the number of tigers in the world in 10 years.

- Sathyamangalam Wildlife Sanctuary was declared as Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve on December 1, 2013.
- * Tamil Nadu Government Award for the year 2021
 - The Chief Minister has ordered to increase the award money from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 5 lakh from the present Rs 1 lakh to awardees to awardees. Along with the award money, a gold medal and a qualifying speech will be presented.

Events in India

* IAS, Service Rules

- The chief ministers of Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Kerala, Telangana, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra and Jharkhand have opposed the Centre's move to change the service rules related to the transfer of IAS officers. Odisha has now joined the list.
- > In 1772, Warren Hasting introduced the post of District Collector for the first time in India.

- > Article 312 of the Constitution
- India's first open rock museum
 - Union Minister for Science and Technology Jitendra Singh inaugurated India's first open rock museum on the premises of The National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI).
- * Major Dhyan Chand Sports University
 - Prime Minister Modi laid the foundation stone of Major Dhyan Chand Sports University to be established in Meerut.
- Himachal Pradesh is the first 100% smoke-free state in the country
 - Himachal Pradesh became the first 100% LPG enabler and became a smoke-free state. This milestone was achieved due to the Central government's Ujjwala Yojana and Grihini Suvidha Yojana.

Water Maintenance Schemes

- Uttar Pradesh tops the list of states with the best implementation of water conservation projects in 2020, followed by Rajasthan at the second position and Tamil Nadu at the third position.
- * India's first Rafale woman pilot
 - > Soldiers of the Indian Air Force marched during the Republic Day parade in Delhi.
 - Shivangi Singh, a woman pilot, was part of the Indian Air Force parade at the Republic Day celebrations. She is india's first female Rafale pilot.

Himachal Pradesh Day

- President Ram Nath Kovind and Prime Minister Narendra Modi have greeted the people of Himachal Pradesh on january 25, the state's formation day.
- > Himachal Pradesh became the 18th state in the country on January 25, 1971.

50th StateHood Day of Manipur, Meghalaya and Tripura

- > On January 21, Manipur, Meghalaya and Tripura celebrated their 50th statehood day.
- > These states were created under the North Eastern Region (Re-organization) Act, 1971.
- Gujarat Court's official language court verdict
 - A division bench of the Gujarat High Court has said that a journalist, who is facing a contempt of court case, should speak only in English in the higher judiciary.
 - Article 348(1) refers to the use of English in the Supreme Court and high courts, as well as the making of bills, laws and orders.
 - Section 348(2) read with Section (7) of the Official Languages Act, 1963, in the High Courts "in addition to English"

- > It talks about the use of Hindi or other official languages.
- * The village without the first sanitary napkin is "Kumbalangi"
 - > Kumbalangi, a village in Kerala, is set to become the first sanitary napkin-free village in India.
 - > Women over the age of 18 are provided with menstrual cups as an alternative.
 - > It is implemented as part of a project called "Avalkayi" (for her).

Festival

- * Losar Festival
 - > The Losar festival is celebrated by the Buddhist community in Ladakh region.
- International Folk Arts Festival
 - Maharashtra-based lavni artist Sumit Bhale won the gold medal at the International Folk Arts Festival in Dubai.
 - > Lavani is the traditional dance form of Maharashtra.

Economy

- Country's economic growth at 8.3%: World Bank
 - According to the World Bank, India's economic growth will be 8.3 per cent in the current financial year (2021-22).
 - > The World Bank was established in July 1944.
 - Headquarters: Washington, Chairman: David Malpass.

Country's economic growth rate is 9%: IMF

- The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has lowered its economic growth estimate for the current fiscal to 9 percent. According to the Fund's World Economic Survey
- According to the Central Statistics Office(CSO), the economy is projected to grow at 9.2 per cent in the current financial year. It was announced that it would be 9.5 per cent in the RBI's estimates.
- ✤ India imports \$55.7 billion in gold by 2021
 - India imported gold worth \$55.7 billion in 2021. India's gold imports are more than double as much as last year.
- Non-Banking Finance Company: 5,845 complaints registered in Chennai
 - According to the Annual Report of the Ambudsman Programmes of the Reserve Bank of India, between July 1, 2020 and March 31, 2021, Ombudsman, 21.68% of the 26,957 complaints received

across India by Ombudsman, in the non-banking financial institutions (NBFCs), were registered in Chennai.

- The Reserve Bank of India announced the grievance redressal mechanism on February 23, 2018. This is applicable to customer NBFCs with a property size of Rs 100 crore and above.
- The scheme is administered through centres in Chennai, Kolkata, Mumbai and New Delhi to deal with complaints received in their respective zones.
- Sebi's new Caste App (Securities Exchange Board of India)
 - With people increasingly indulging in stock trading through mobile phones, SEBI has launched a new mobile app called 'Saathi' to create awareness among investors about the fundamentals of the stock market. Sebi chairman Ajay Tyagi launched the app.
 - It was established on April 2, 1988. Headquartered in Mumbai.

Mango exported to USA by Indian mambalam

The Government of India has received approval from the Us Department of Agriculture to export Indian mangoes to the US during the new season.

World

Female captain of a nuclear-armed warship

Amy Barnsheimite has been appointed as the captain of a nuclear warship in the United States. She was the first woman to be appointed captain of a nuclear warship in the United States.

* Nusandra, the new capital of Indonesia

- Due to the continued rise in sea levels, the city of Nusandra on the jungle cloud island of Borneo is set to be developed from Jakarta, the capital of Indonesia.
- > Nusandra, a city in Indonesia, is to be developed as its capital.

Pakistan appoints first woman judge of Supreme Court

- Justice Aisha Malik of the Lahore High Court has been appointed as the first woman judge of the Pakistan Supreme Court.
- The Word for Children of the Year 2021
 - Oxford University Press, based on its recent research, has chosen a word called 'anxiety' as the child's word for 2021.

International Monetary Fund - Chief Economist

- > Pierre Olivier Coricez will be the next chief economist of the International Monetary Fund (IMF).
- > Imf was established on December 27, 1945. Member States: 196

* Zirfit flies

- Researchers have also discovered a new species called Monoceromyia nigra in Dindigul district of Tamil Nadu along with *Monoceromyia flavoscutata*.
- > These newly discovered species have been classified as a new type of syrphid flies.
- > *Monozyromia flavos bayata* was discovered in Dindigul district of Tamil Nadu.
- > *Monoceromia nigra* was detected in Bastar district of Arunachal Pradesh.
- * Karial crocodiles introduced to Orang National Park
 - The government has formulated a policy to reintroduce kariyal, which was earlier extinct from the Brahmaputra river system in the 1950s. With better protection, the length of the Kaziranga Orang landscape will be ideal for karialai crocodiles.
 - Other national parks in Assam are Kaziranga, Manas, Nameri, Dibru Saikhowa, Raimona and Dehing Patkai.

* Madhya Pradesh: Tiger dies after giving birth to 29 cubs in 11 years

- A 17-year-old 'Kalarwali' tiger, popularly known as 'T15', has died in the Pench Tiger Reserve in Madhya Pradesh, officials said. The tiger has given birth to 29 cubs in 11 years.
- The Pench Tiger Reserve or Pench National Park is located on the borders of two states, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra.

* The forest cover in India is 2,261 sq km. Increase

- In the last two years, 2,261 sq km of land has been acquired in India. According to the report, the forest cover has increased to the extent.
- > Forest Survey of India conducts forest cover survey once in two years.

* Kerala's first bird atlas

The Kerala Bird Atlas (KBA), India's first-of-its-kind state-level bird atlas, has generated basic data on the distribution of bird species across all major habitats.

Miss Kerala

- The freshwater fish species called Denison Barb is called Miss Kerala. It is mostly found in the states of Kerala and Karnataka.
- > The Wildlife Protection Reforms (Amendment) Bill, 2021 was introduced in Parliament recently.
- > In this, the Denison Barb type of fish are placed in Table 1.

- * First Indian woman to complete space programme
 - Jahnavi Dangeti, a young woman from Andhra Pradesh, has become the first Indian to complete NASA's International Aviation and Space Programme (IASP NASA) at kennedy space center in Alabama, USA.
- * Omicron TestIng Tool : Om
 - The Central Pharmaceutical Research Institute of the Central Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) has developed an indigenously designed 'OM', an RT-PCR-based infection diagnostic tool.

- * Chairman, Indian Council of Historical Research
 - Raghuvendra Tanwar has been selected as the chairman of the Indian Council of Historical Research.
- Global beauty pageant for transgenders
 - Shruti Sithara, who hails from Kerala, India, has bagged the title of world number one in the beauty pageant for transgenders.
- Urjit Patel appointed vice-chairman of AIIB
 - Urjit Patel, a former governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), has been appointed as the vicechairman of the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB).

- * S Somnath appointed as isro's new chairman
 - Kerala-based scientist S Somnath has been appointed as the new (10th) chairman of ISRO and secretary of the department of space.
- T.S. has been appointed as the chairman of the UN Security Council's Counter-Terrorism Committee. Thirumoorthy takes charge
 - U.N. 2022 India's Ambassador to the UN TS Tirumurti has taken over as the chairman of the Security Council's Counter-Terrorism Group.
- Appointment of Chief Economic Advisor
 - V Anantha Nageswaran has been appointed as the Chief Economic Advisor to the Government of India.
- Environmentalist M.K.Prasad passes away

- M.K. Prasad led the Kerala Shastra Sahitya Parishad (KSSP), a people's movement. In the 1970s, when the Kerala government took steps to set up a hydroelectric project in the Silentaveli forest area in Palakkad district, he led the agitation against it.
- Under his leadership, the KSSB actively worked to protect the biodiversity of silent valley and led to the public's voice being raised. The silent fence struggle received international attention.

* Kathak dancer Birju Maharaj passes away

Puducherry Lt Governor Tamilisai Soundararajan and Chief Minister N Rangasamy launched the Akshaya Patra midday meal scheme in Puducherry.

* Read India (Padhe Bharat) Scheme

On January 1, 2022, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan launched a 100-day reading campaign 'Fateh Bharat' to improve the learning level of students.

* 3.68 crore people registered under Atal Pension Yojana in 6 years

- So far, 3.68 crore people have registered under the Atal Pension Yojana. More than 65 lakh subscribers have registered in the current financial year alone.
- > The Atal Pension Yojana was launched on May 9, 2015.
- > The project has been replaced by a project called Suvaalamban.

Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana

- Providing financial assistance to farmers in case of crop loss and crop damage due to unusual circumstances through Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana.
- > A premium of 2% is charged for kharif crops, 1.5% for rabi crops and 5% for fruit varieties.

Pradhan Mantri Kisan Reward Promotion Scheme

- On February 24, 2019, the Central government launched the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Kisan Reward Promotion Scheme (PM KISAN Samman Nidhi Yojana) for small and marginal farmers.
- Under this scheme, small and marginal farmers owning up to 5 acres of land will get Rs.2,000 per annum in three instalments of Rs.2,000 once in 4 months. 6,000 is provided. This amount is being disbursed directly into the bank accounts of the farmers.

Summit

- * 1st BRICS Sherpas Meeting of 2022
 - The first BRICS Sherpass meeting was held in 2022 and China has been elected as the president of the BRICS in 2022 on a rotational basis.
 - > India's BRICS Sherpa: Sanjay Bhattacharya.

Exercises

- "C Dragon" naval military exercise
 - India is also participating in an international exercise called C Dragon in Guam in the western Pacific region along with the Quad(Quad), Canada and South Korea.
 - The exercise, which will take place at the Anderson Air Force Base in Guam, will be attended by the Indian Navy, the US Navy, the Royal Australian Air Force, the Royal Canadian Air Force, the Japan Maritime Self-Defence Force and the South Korean Navy.

* Chiru-2Q22 Naval Exercise

> Russia, China and Iran held a joint naval exercise in the Gulf of Oman.
